The Florrie has an exciting opportunity for a Sessional Play Worker to join our team and deliver activity sessions for children aged 7-12 during school holidays. We are seeking a reliable and passionate individual to organise and deliver a diverse programme of activities in our new purpose-built youth zone, The Basement. This incredible space includes a state-of-the-art cinema, radio station, and activity zone designed specifically for children and young people.

The ideal candidate will foster a positive and safe environment for young people and bring energy, creativity and care to every session.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Plan and deliver a range of safe, engaging and well-organised activity days for children aged 7-12, according to a prepared Holiday Club timetable.
- Utilise the resources available in The Basement (cinema, games room, sports areas, radio studio) to create varied and engaging activities that maximise use of the space.
- Prepare, acquire, set up and pack away all resources for activities, before and after sessions.
- Work closely with colleagues and volunteers to ensure the smooth running of sessions.
- Coordinate daily breakfast and lunch for Holiday Club attendees.
- Coordinate occasional days out for Holiday Club attendees using the centre's minibus.
- Maintain attendance records and incident logs, and contribute to the monitoring and evaluation of sessions.
- Communicate effectively and appropriately with children, families, and staff.
- Encourage children's creativity, cooperation, and confidence through structured and free play activities.
- Respond to the individual needs of children and support their development.
- Maintain a safe and supportive environment in line with safeguarding policies and procedures.
- Manage any concerns appropriately and report incidents following safeguarding protocols.
- Act as a positive role model, ensuring the physical and emotional wellbeing of all children.
- Conduct appropriate risk assessments and health and safety checks before, during and after sessions.
- Contribute ideas and feedback to improve sessions and service delivery.



ESSENTIAL REQUIREMENTS

- Minimum of 2 years' experience working with children aged 7–12 in a play, youth, or education setting.
- Experience planning and delivering activity programmes for young people.
- Strong understanding of the importance of play in children's development and wellbeing.
- Good knowledge of the challenges facing young people.
- Awareness of safeguarding and health and safety practices in settings for children.
- Availability during school holidays.
- Strong communication skills and ability to work as part of a team.
- Reliable, enthusiastic, and confident in leading play activities.
- Self-motivated and organised, with good initiative and time management skills.
- Flexible and adaptable, able to respond to the needs of a dynamic environment.
- Youth Work qualification and/or MVQ in Playworking desirable
- A Full D1 UK Driving Licence and willingness to drive our minibus. You do not need access to your own vehicle.
